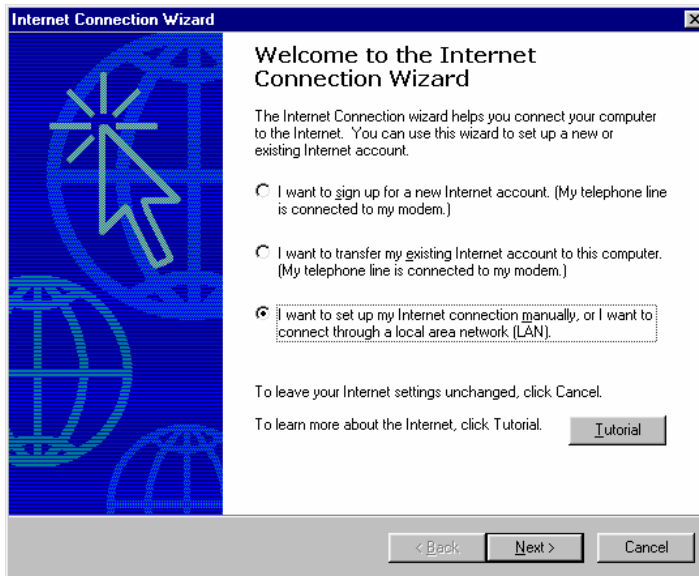
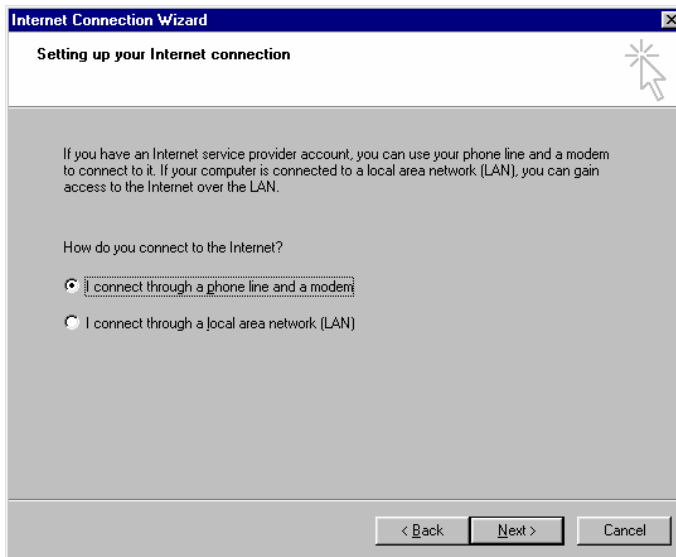


Windows 95/98/Me Internet Connection and E-mail Setup

1. Click **Start**, select **Settings**, then select **Control Panel**.
2. Double-click on the **Internet** or **Internet Options** icon.
3. Click the **Connections** tab at the top of the Internet Options tab page.
4. Click the **Setup** button at the top of the Connections tab page. This will open the Internet Connection Wizard. This will walk you through setting up a connection and email account.



5. Select the "I want to set up my Internet connection manually...".
6. Click **Next**.
7. Select "I connect through a phone line and modem".



8. Click **Next**.

9. Type the Internet connection access number for your city.




10. Enter your username and password from the sheet provided by KMTelecom.

11. Click **Next**.

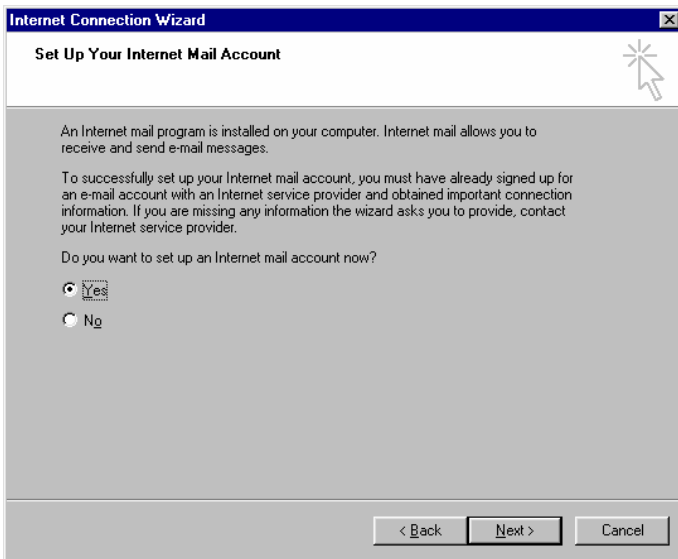
12. Type KMTelecom as the connection name. You can also leave the default name in the Connection name field if you prefer.

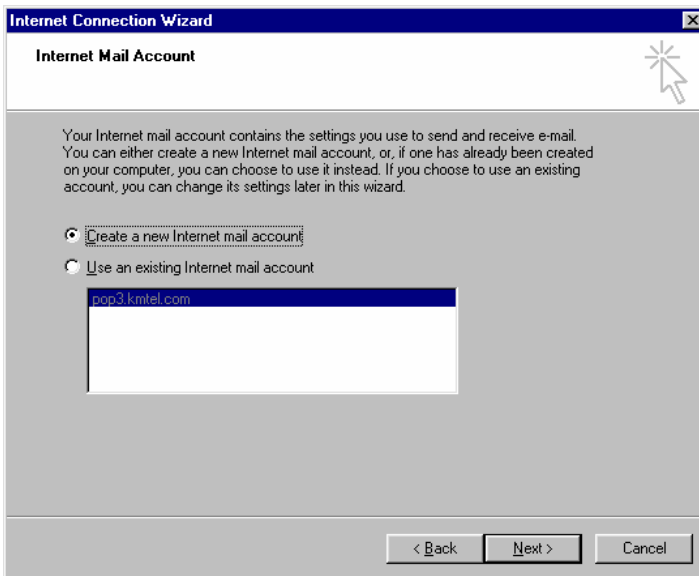
13. Click **Next**.

14. Select Yes to setup an Internet mail account.




15. Click **Next**.

16. Select Create a new Internet mail account.




17. Click **Next**.

18. Type the name you would like to appear in the "From" field when you send an email.
19. Click **Next**.





20. Type your email address.
21. Click **Next**.

22. Select **POP3** as the type of incoming mail server.
23. Type **pop3.kmtel.com** for the incoming mail server name.
24. Type **smtp.kmtel.com** for the outgoing mail server name.
25. Click **Next**.



26. Type your username and password provided. Make sure you use lowercase letters.
27. Check the Remember password box.


If your Internet service provider requires you to use Secure Password Authentication (SPA) to access your mail account, select the "Log On Using Secure Password Authentication (SPA)" check box.

28. Click **Finish** to complete the connection wizard.
29. You should now be able to connect to the Internet by double-clicking on the Internet Explorer icon on your main desktop. If you do not hear your computer dial out, you may need to manually start the connection. See the topic "Start the connection manually" at the end of this document.

To disable Call Waiting

1. Click **Start**.
2. Select **Control Panel**.
3. Double-click on the **Modems** icon.
4. Click on the **Dialing Properties** button.
5. Check the "To disable call waiting..." box.
6. Select ***70**, in the drop down box to the right.
7. Click **OK** to save your changes.

Note: You must also have the connections properties set to use the area code and dialing properties.

To start a connection manually

1. Create a shortcut for the connection icon on your desktop (if not done already).
 - a. Open **My Computer** on the desktop (main screen).
 - b. Open **Dialup Networking**.
 - c. Click the right mouse button on the connection icon you created and select "Create a shortcut". You will get a message telling you that you can't create a shortcut here. Click "Yes" to create the shortcut on the desktop.
2. Double-click on the connection shortcut on the desktop.
3. After the connection is established, open Internet Explorer to connect to the Internet, or open Outlook Express to work with your email.
